This letter is offered as the report of investigation activities at the Former Augusta Refinery in the accordance with Section X, "Reporting," of the Administrative Order on Consent dated Octoberated with Activities 24, 2003, Docket No. RCRA-07-2004-0009. This report addresses activities occurring during the Activities of October 1 through December 31, 2007.

Description of Activities

The following field activities were completed, and if appropriate, in accordance with respective and a Sampling and Analysis Plans (SAPs):

- October 5, completed additional arsenic sampling at 9 tank groups within AOC 5, including Groups 2, 4, 6, 11, 17, 18, 19, 20, and 21. Due to their size and proximity to each other, the surface areas of Groups 17, 18, and 19 were combined and considered as a single group.
- October 18, completed repairs at 4 monitor wells including P-12S, P-12D, P-16D (offsite) and SWMU 10A (onsite). The surface completion of these wells had been damaged during mowing activities by others.
- October 30, performed landfill cover inspections on SWMU 8 (East Landfill), SWMU 9 (Industrial Landfill Cell 1-7), SWMU 17 (Asphalt Landfill), AOC B (Former landfill North of Effluent Oxidation Pond), and AOC D (Asphalt Material Disposal Areas Cells D-1 through D-7).
- December 5, completed additional surface soil sampling at AOC 1 ((Surface Water Drainage Ditches), AOC C (Former Pond Area), AOC E (Sludge Pond No. 2), AOC F (Area of Surface Staining), and SWMU 4 (East Landfarm). All were sampled for determining the extent of TEL contamination. AOC F was also sampled for lead.
